

From the Principal

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We are all really back into the swing of things.

Parental Involvement

On Monday night we held our Annual General Meeting and Parent Information Night. This evening provided an excellent opportunity for me to share with parents the value of parents engaging in their child's education. Parent involvement is the great equaliser. Thirty years of research has shown that socio-economic status, parents' education, ethnic background don't matter as much to the success of students. When parents are involved, students achieve more.

Students will achieve higher grades, complete home learning more consistently, demonstrate more positive attitudes and behaviour if their parents are involved. There are lots of ways to be involved in your child's education and in the life of the school. Ask your child questions about their day, make a quiet space available at home for their learning, listen to your child read and ask them about texts when they have read them. In all of these ways you are setting your child up for success.

Seesaw

I am also very pleased to announce that this year all of our classes and our new OSHC service will be picking up the seesaw application. This application provided parents with real time news about their own child's learning. Parents are asked to download the app to their phones and then use their child's unique code so that individual learning can be shared instantly and regularly with relative ease. Teachers spoke to families about seesaw at the information sessions on Monday night. If you require information, please see/email your child's class teacher.

Political Agenda

With only four weeks to go until the State Election, there is increasing pressure on politicians to secure as many votes as possible. You may be aware that towards the end of last year, the State Labor Government announced an increase in recurrent funding for Catholic schools and the provision of \$5.5M in capital funding for Catholic schools in our state. While we welcome this additional funding, it seems a drop in the ocean when around the same time, the State Government gifted public schools with \$690M for upgrades.

Then 2 weeks ago, the Labor Government announced every year 10 public school student across South Australia would receive a Government funded laptop under a State Government investment to prepare students for their future careers. And on the same day, it was announced that Public schools would receive \$57 million to support students with special needs.

We might argue that students with special needs in Catholic schools are equally deserving of additional funds and that year 10 students in Catholic colleges also deserve to be prepared for their future careers. Why would you give laptops to all students, many whose families could afford to purchase their own? Why would this offer not be means tested and offered to students in all schooling sectors whose parents are unable to purchase a laptop for their child?

These are questions you might like to ask your local candidates as we work to secure the best possible outcomes for students in Catholic schools across our state. To this end, you will find a template letter emailed to all families which I strongly encourage you to complete and send, along with your family, parishioners and friends.

There will be more information coming to parents and caregivers in the next 4 weeks, giving you information about what each of the major parties is offering Catholic school students. Music Programme

Emmaus offers an instrumental Music programme, with lessons in piano, guitar, violin, flute, saxophone, clarinet and voice.

Lessons are available to students from Years 1 – 7, on an individual basis with an instrumental teacher. Fees for instrumental lessons range from \$12.50 - \$22 per lesson, depending on the instrument, and are payable a term in advance.

Students will be required to buy their music books, as well as buy or hire their instrument. I can provide information about buying or hiring for each instrument, should you require further information.


