IN THE MIDST OF THE EASTER SEASON

Well, we may have finished eating our chocolate eggs and bunnies (some of us, perhaps), but Easter is much bigger than just one day. In our Catholic liturgical calendar, Easter is a season of time and we celebrate this time by sharing the stories of Jesus' resurrection. In fact, the Easter season is six weeks long!

No doubt, if we had been alive in Jesus' time we, like his disciples, would have been astonished by the miracle of his resurrection. "Jesus' Resurrection was about breaking out into an entirely new form of life, into a life that is no longer subject to the laws of dying and becoming, but lies beyond it – a life that opens up a new dimension of human existence."

Throughout history, Jesus has been transforming lives and drawing people to greatness. Today, Jesus is WITH US ALWAYS, challenging us and strengthening us to be more. We can know that what Jesus offers is TRUTH simply because of how his presence and his call to love enlivens our relationships, brings us to wholeness and gives us a happiness that never goes away.

Now, what would we have been thinking if we were one of Jesus' followers on that first Easter day?
