

Volunteer Requirements

All families will shortly receive a volunteer pack. In this pack will be information about volunteer requirements including Police Check application forms, Volunteer Details forms and Responding to Abuse and Neglect online training information for volunteers. It is now a requirement that all volunteers undertake this training which outlines different kinds of abuse, signs of abuse and how to report suspected abuse. The training is expected to take about one hour and can be done in any online environment - computers at school will also be available for people who would prefer to use these. Certificates will be generated when individuals have completed their training and we ask all volunteers to bring their certificates into school for us to keep a copy of on file. While this is another administrative task to undertake, we understand that the safety and well-being of all our students is our number one priority and we all need to do as much as possible to keep our children safe. , God loves us and he washes people's feet.' (Michael)


'God loves us. God made the world and God is with us.' (Paige)

Jottings from Joy

Work-life Balance. Do you work to live, or live to work?

In our modern life most of us always seem to be "on duty". We get notifications on our phones of what friends near and far are doing on Facebook, Messenger, Instagram etc. In some ways we are more connected but have less contact with real people. We seem to feel more at the beck and call of others. Our "Fear of missing out" means we check our phones and devices regularly, interrupting our work and our leisure time. We feel compelled to respond to that text or email even though we may be technically "off duty".

I came across a little story that seems to echo a common theme:

..... Once upon a time in a land faraway, the office opened at 8am. Cheerful, well rested employees came to work and laboured energetically all day. The office closed promptly at 5pm, the employees went home to have dinner with their families. The work day was over. Now it was time for *REST AND RESTORATION*. Sound like a fairy tale? For many of us, this is not even remotely like our work life.

......Years later, travellers from the West brought new inventions – the computer, the internet and the mobile phone – all designed to save time, increase productivity and *REDUCE STRESS*. Soon the employees were hunched over machines from dawn to dusk. At the end of a full day, they packed up their laptops only to plug them in again at home. As they gathered around the coffee machine in the morning, one after the other bragged about how late they had worked the night before. Now, that sounds more like reality, right?

Suggestions for re-focussing your Work-Life Balance:

- Think before you send that late-night email or text. Just because you are up and alert, doesn't
 mean the receiver is in the same space. Do not automatically assume they will respond
 immediately.
- **Protect leisure and family time**. Set boundaries and no-electronic-devices times and don't feel guilty sticking to them.
- Use mealtimes for connecting and talking face to face.
- *Play games* or do puzzles together Pictionary, Uno, brain-teasers
- **Build exercise into your life.** Walking alone is a great time to think and walking with others you have a captive audience ready to chat and reconnect.
- Write an "Absolute Yes List" the top 5 priorities that need your attention over the next 3 months. Ask "What most needs my attention right now?" and "What am I prepared to let go of?"

Children, young people and adults need the opportunity to learn about how death, separation, divorce, chronic illness or other significant loss events may impact on their lives. The Seasons for Growth® program provides an opportunity for participants to learn the knowledge, skills and attitudes required to understand and respond well to such experiences. This is a small group program which meets during school hours, to:

- > support children and young people to understand and respond well to the issues they experience as a result of death, separation, divorce or other significant change and loss in their lives
- assist children and young people to understand that their feelings and other reactions are normal
- develop skills for coping, problem solving and decision making
- build a peer support network
- help restore self-confidence and self-esteem
- educate children and young people about the grief process.

If you think your child would benefit from participating in a Seasons for Growth group, with our Chaplain Joy as their "Companion" talk to him/her about participating in the program.
