The Future of the Internet of Things is all about Intelligence (ours as well as the machines)

Online safety is something we should all be very aware of. It is something that applies equally at home and school.

Although the following story is quite amusing it does make you question just what is accessible on your devices and how much do you let your children use them.

Toddler Accidentally Purchases Car on eBay Using Dad's Smartphone

While many parents let their children play with their smartphone or other mobile device for temporary amusement, a story out of Oregon may make some think twice about the practice. According to reports, a 14-month toddler named Sorella Stoute managed to bid on and win an auction on eBay for a 1962 Austin Healy Sprite, buying the junked vehicle (with the name "FrankenSprite" printed on its door) for



\$225 using her father's logged-in account with the eBay app. While the parents could have nullified the sale, they ultimately decided to keep the car — and the father, Paul Stoute, plans on restoring it and presenting to Sorella on her 16th birthday. The parents learned of the purchase through an email from eBay after the auction.

Stoute said his daughter enjoys playing on his iPhone. The girl's mother, told the station that her husband has "a major project" ahead of him with the car, known as "FrankenSprite." "It comes with two engines," she said. "They're both in the back seat." She added that the incident "cannot happen again" as the couple have since added password protection to their phones, and deleted apps that have the option of making purchases. Given the propensity of somewhat older children to rack up enormous bills on in-app purchases that are part of most free games, the Stoutes will likely need to keep a close eye on Sorella as she gets older.

- Do you have password protection on your devices?
- Do the children know the passwords? (don't laugh, it happens)
- Are you aware of what your children are doing on any device in the house that can connect to the internet?
- Do you know which devices in your house can connect to the internet?

Driving a car can be quite dangerous but rather than banning our children from ever driving a car we teach them how to do it sensibly and safely. It is no different with going online. It is the responsibility of all of us, at school and home, to teach our children how to be safe and sensible online.

SAINT MARY OF THE CROSS -AUSTRALIA'S SAINT



Today we celebrated the Feast Day of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop with a whole school mass.

Mary gave her life completely to God. Every decision, every action, every word spoken was guided by her faith. She saw in Jesus the example of how we are to live our human life- quite simply, with love for all.

Is it that simple?

Jesus said... "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13: 34)

Yep- that simple!

But the challenge comes when we are faced with conflict and difference in our world. The challenge comes when others hurt us or bully us. The challenge comes when others show hate towards us. But in these times, Jesus says: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13: 34)

That is just what Mary MacKillop did. She looked beyond difference and division. She showed forgiveness without holding grudges. She saw the injustice and disadvantaged and gave her life to bringing love to all.

"Happiness is very much an inside job, but we depend so much on each other for happiness, especially in marriage, both as givers and receivers. I can forget the indisputable fact that no one, no institution, no marriage, is perfect. *Remember on this earth that no one is perfect (M. MacKillop 1889).* We are never the finished product. That included you and me and even our Saint Mary MacKillop.

Mary *found* her *happiness in making others happy.* This was the approach she learnt from Jesus. It does mean **living with imperfection in ourselves and others.**

Reject no one (M. MacKillop 1867). Judge not (M. MacKillop 1869)

It also means **not giving in to self-pity** when life seems hard. At these times Mary would say that *the cross may press* very heavily but you can be happy for all this (M. MacKillop 1890) by trying to forget yourself and making others happy." Taken from "The Little Brown Book" -S & L Kane 2009.

So, as we celebrate this special feast day on our calendar, let us consider ways we too can continue this work... started by Jesus. How can we bring God's love into our world? And how can be experience the deep, unshakeable happiness that comes when we live like this?


