Dear Parents and Caregivers,

## A calm place at Emmaus

You may be aware that Emmaus staff have been involved in a special research project this year, designed to increase learning outcomes for all students. The question the staff posed was, "What strategies best help students regulate and lead to increased time on academic learning?" The academic learning is the end game we want all students achieving at.

We know ourselves that learning happens best when we are calm and relaxed. Trying to concentrate or perform a new skill is much more difficult when we are anxious, frightened or stressed – remember when you had to parallel park during your driving test! When we are calm, we engage the prefrontal cortex, the part of the brain that helps us attend to instructions and undertake given tasks. This is true for our students too.

To enable greater attention and performance in the classroom, staff have been trialling a range of strategies to determine which have the greatest effect on the regulation of students. We have replaced the bells at the end of each play period with three pieces of music which decrease in speed, designed to help students return to class more calmly. We have also introduced calming spaces and 'soft landings' (deliberately planned quiet activities intended to further calm students) for a few minutes, in all classes, after the morning bell and end of Recess and Lunch so that students are ready to learn. This term, staff are implementing the 'Mind-Up' curriculum –designed to build resilience to stress, and develop a positive mind-set in both school and life.

Data we are collecting, suggests that these changes are making a difference to students, enabling teachers to spend maximum time on academic learning. These changes are here for the long term as we seek to do everything we can to improve the learning outcomes for all students at Emmaus. Ask your child about the 'new bell music' or the calming space in his/her classroom.

#### Staffing

Lauren Adams, Yr 3 teacher, has requested and been granted, a term of Long Service Leave for term four this year. Justine Raponi will continue with this class for three days a week and she will be joined two days a week by Ms Amanda Fairley (our PE teacher two days a week).

As you know, Ms Brooke Moore is expecting her first child towards the end of this year. I am currently in the process of selecting a suitable replacement for Brooke, commencing mid term four 2018.

As part of their economics learning, our Middle School students have developed small businesses. Students are invited to bring \$2-\$5 to spend at the carnival- and of course parents and family members are most welcome to join in the fun! Teachers would love some help on the stalls too!

The Catholic Charities appeal is held each year, supported by the Catholic community in Adelaide –through parishes and schools. It is important to remember that Catholic Charities support South Australians who need the help desperately provided by the Catholic Welfare agencies. The charitable agencies supported by Catholic Charities include:

#### **Catherine House**

Catherine House offers emergency and transitional supported accommodation to single adult women over 21 years who are homeless.

#### **Aim Karim**

The Sisters of St Joseph have established permanent accommodation and care for adults with intellectual disabilities.

## **Catholic Deaf Association**

The Sisters of St Joseph, through the Catholic Deaf Centre, provide services for people who are deaf.

## St Patrick's Special School & Our Lady of La Vang School (formerly St Ann's Special School)

Cater for children with intellectual and multiple disabilities, with students ranging in age from 5-20.

## **Hesed Christian Community**

Hesed has a Catholic Christian ethos, but caters for all comers-Christian, non-Christians, all age groups, individuals, families, people from a wide range of cultures, with physical, emotional and mental disabilities, and drug, gambling and alcohol addiction.

#### **Louise Place**

Offers supported accommodation for homeless pregnant teenagers, with support in counseling, life skills and general education.

## **Centacare Catholic Family Services**

Works with around 20,000 people each year providing a wide range of counseling, education and support services. Help is available for individuals, couples and families throughout the state for issues including: marital disputes, parenting problems, family breakdowns, grief and homelessness. Centacare has an office in our parish community on Bains Road.

#### **Hutt Street Centre**

Run by the Daughters of Charity, this is a meal and day centre for the homeless people in Adelaide. Men, women and at time children attend the centre. Over 2000 people access the centre with approximately 51,000 meals being served each year.

## **Aboriginal Catholic Ministry**

The Otherway Centre at St Peters offers Indigenous Catholics a Sunday Eucharist. This Ministry also provides the wider indigenous community with counseling, a drop-in service, outreach to street kids and visiting people on the streets, in hospital, in parks, at their homes or in prison.

Each family will receive a Catholic Charities envelope. This will provide further information about the charities, but also provide the opportunity for families to donate themselves, if they wish.



"Really?" said Pooh in surprise. "I would never have thought that. You always seem so happy and like you have got everything in life all sorted out."


